
NICHOLAS LOUIS SCRATTISH, 1942 - 1982

Historian Nick Scrattish died unexpectedly on Friday afternoon, 17 September 1982. He was known in the National Park Service as a fine writer and "damned good historian," to quote Senior Historian (Retired) John Luzader.

Prior to joining the National Park Service four years ago, Nick served in the US Navy in the Caribbean, and taught on the College level in California. He held a Ph.D. from the University of California at San Diego with a specialty in the Spanish settlement of the New World, especially Mexico and Peru. Nick and his tenacious scholarship will be missed by his colleagues at the Denver Service Center.
