## **Sociedad de Estudios Quiroguianos** (Horacio Quiroga Society)

The Sociedad de Estudios Quiroguianos (Horacio Quiroga Society) was recently established to bring together those researchers who write, or have an interest in writing on the work of Horacio Quiroga. The aim of the Society is to assist in the sharing of information among its members, as well as to provide a means for discussion of Quiroga's work.

Among various plans, the Sociedad de Estudios Quiroguianos intends to:

- \*Up-date and inform members of bibliographical information as well as current research being carried out, through periodic announcements.
- \*Establish a Quiroga Library and Archive.
