I am pleased to announce that the International Society for Comparative Psychology is now publishing its Journal with the assistance of Allen Press, Inc. This issue is being sent to all our subscribers, and we trust that you will renew your subscription so that you will receive the balance of Volume 5, which is now being printed for distribution. Issue #2 will feature a target article by E. A. Salzen on the nature of emotion with commentaries by D. Candland; M. & B. Lewis; J. P. Scott; and P. V. Simonov. Issue #3 presents research reports by M. Delsaut (France); W. Pisula, P. M. Ostaszewski and J. Matysisk (Poland); G. D. Carbines, R. M. Dennis and R. R. Jackson (New Zealand) and P. Roubertoux (France). Issue #4 is devoted to comparative and neuropsychological research in human factors psychology, with papers by D. A. White, D. A. Washburn, R. K. Thomas, and D. M. Rumbaugh and S. L. Williams. Volume 6 will feature the following in addition to research articles: an issue containing previously unpublished documents by V. A. Wagner and B. I. Khotin about the history of comparative psychology in pre-Soviet and Soviet Russia with commentaries by D. Joravsky, N. L. Kremmentsov, D. B. Malakhovskaya, L. Medacci and V. E. Sokolov and L. M. Baskin; an issue presenting observations by W. Koehler of the behavior of an orangutan published in English for the first time with commentaries by various investigators of primate behavior; a target article by E. Prato Previde, M. Colombetti, M. Poli and F. C. Spada on animal cognition with commentaries by R. A. Boakes, G. G. Gallup, Jr., J. P. Rossi and C. Robinson; and an issue presenting multiple reviews of the book by R. M. Lerner, *Final Solutions: biology, prejudice and genocide*.

With the publication of Volumes 5 and 6, my term of office as editor comes to an end. I wish to thank all the authors and reviewers who helped me to bring the first six volumes of the Journal to press, as well as the various editorial assistants who helped us meet deadlines, etc. The Society invites nominations for the position of editor, and these should be sent to me or our Secretary-Treasurer, Dr. Sally A.
