(Editors' Note: *The following letter was received from the Ohio State Reformatory, Mansfield, Ohio.*)

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

I am writing this letter in representation of the African American Culture Club (AACC). We are a group of Black inmates that have come together to educate ourselves and other interested people to our African heritage and culture and to the Black man's position here in the United States.
